## Epitome of Telegraphic News.

DATES TO MARCH 21.

New York, March 20 -The Herald's special Toronto dispatch from Ostawa, says that a battery left there for the trontier on Saturday, and other detackments of troops for the front are reported at four different points. The organization of new companies was going forward with great activity. The alarm seems to be unabated. Everybody now believes that the Fenians mean to make a desperate attempt to obtain Canada as a base. Very little dependence is placed on the American Government's profes sions of neutrality. The authorities feel that they can expect no sympathy from the United States, and must help themselves if they would maintain

The published statements show that 10,000 regulars and 1,000 volunteers are under arms, and 1,500 more men are drilled and armed but not under

The Herald's Toronto special dispatch says: A plot is reported to have been discovered to blow up the drill shed and volunteers while arilling. A large city sewer runs under the drill shed, with its entrance one hundred yards off. The report says that barrels of powder were to be rolled up the sewer, and when the volunteers met for drill in the shed, the whole were to be blown up. The sewer is now

New York, March 20.—Advices per steamer Marietta from Vera Cruz show that confirmation is furnished regarding the critical position of the Imperialists at Chimpec. The Republicans are threatening the town, bringing the force within some thirty miles of it. In the Pacific States the Imperialists were still confined to a few posts, the Republicans holding all the country. The latter had boldly attacked the garrison on three occasions in five weeks.

New York, Murch 20 -The Herald's Rio Janeiro correspondent gives turther advices regarding the Rio Platte war. Immense preparations were making for the battle which was imminent at the date of last advices. The allied army of Brazilians and Urugua yans, numbering about 50,000, and supported by a considerable and effi-cient naval fleet, are on the banks of the Paraguay river, in the vicinity of Paso de la Platte, controlled on the north side by the Paraguayans, esti-mated at only 22,000 men. Works of great strength, however, are held by the latter, which neutralizes the number and advantages possessed by the allies. The latter; it is reported, design to cross the river. A desperate struggle was anticipated. They had a so in contemplation a flank movement and an attack on the Paraguayan's rear. Parties of Paraguayans had crossed in boats over the river. Skirmishing bad occurred. The allies, however, had repulsed the Paraguay. ans with small loss.


