FROM MONTANA. We compile the following news items from the Montana Post of the 24th ult.

VIRGINIA CITY ITEMS. An exceedingly rich ledge of auriferous quartz has been discovered, near what is known as German Bar, Alder Gulch.

Pork, on foot, sells, in this part of the world, at a very good price, and, as the item is not quoted in our market report, we give it for the benefit of our friends in the States.

Two men, J. R. Hawley, of Gold Hill, Nevada, and N. W. Ferry, from Missouri, went out on a hunting expedition in the Yellowstone country, in November last.

M. G. F. Cope, who runs a 15-stamp steam custom mill, in Hot Spring District, belonging to the firm of Raglan, Cope & Napton, brought into our office a mass of retorted gold, weighing \$2,767, being the product of one week's crushing of quartz from the Pony lode.

HELENA ITEMS. A lot, twenty five feet front, on Main street, below Waterbury & Perkins' sold, this week, for \$1,200.

On the trail from Uncle Johnny's Gulch to Diamond City, an unfortunate man, whose name is unknown, was found frozen to death a few days since.

There are in the Helena Hospital, ten patients, every one of them frozen in some part of the body or limbs.

Two men, Michael McDonnell and Thomas Kevlehan, engaged in drifting in Confederate Gulch, at a depth of forty feet, and at a distance of seventy feet from the entrance, lost their lives by the caving of their work.

On Sunday, February 18 h, the body of a man was brought into town, and recognized as Phillip Farley, of Silver Creek.
