DATES TO MARCH 24.

Chicago, March 22.—The Washington correspondent of the Boston Post says the new American loan project should be well understood as it will mostly be reported back favorably by the Committee and pass the House.

Fort Leavenworth, March 22.—On the 8th inst., the District Headquarters removed to Fort Ray. The 12th U. S. Infantry is in command at Fort Leavenworth.

Col. Williams, well known as Adjutant General of the Army of the Potomac, has become insane, and has been sent to the Asylum, at Augusta, Me.

The Charleston Courier says it is hardly possible to imagine the extent to which the smallpox prevails throughout the entire South. In some places, the blacks furnish the most victims, while in other places, the white population suffer most.

Washington, March 22.—In the Senate, Mr. Anthony, from the printing committee reported a resolution to print 5,000 copies of the special report of the Revenue Commission.

Mr. Hendricks asked if a minority report had been presented.

Mr. Sherman said it had not. Mr. Days, of Chicago, member of the Commission, had made a report in favor of taxing U. S. securities and cancelling the national debt, and this had not been printed.

On motion of Mr. Hendricks the resolution was amended so as to include Mr. Hays' report, and passed.

Mr. Harris called up a bill abolishing the Southern Judicial District of California and the western district of each State.

The bill passed. Mr. Brown called up the bill to authorize the construction of a bridge over the Mississippi river at St. Louis, which passed.
