Montana and New Gaenada.-From a hew journal juat atarted in San Francisco, called the Miner, devoted entirely to the mining interests of the Pacific coast, wo eut the following rather interesting account of tho dif ferent mines now attracting public attention :
From all parta of the compass we bear of new, and in many eases, im portant mineral discoverits on this coast. The most important of which are withiu the new Territory of Mon-
tana, in what is known as the Blacktana, in what is known as the Black-
foot country. There is but little doubt that a tract of country embracing the moantainous regions extending from the Missouri to British Columbia, is exceedingly rich in placer diggingn Nearly seven bundred miles of this vast mineral store-house has been "prospected," and is known to be rich. The prosent centre of attraction is near the now city of Helena, near the very summit of the Rocky Mountains, and within a few miles of the Missouti river. We have not been able to pre. pare for publication the materials at our disposal at this time, but in our next isbue we shall give a full account oniy state that the prineipal placer mines now being worked ure on the west side of the summit of the Rocky Mountains, the snows on the east side being too deep to admit of mining operations at this season. The whole region is oomposed of granite, slate and volcanic rocks, and their debris precisely such as characterize the mining districts of this State and Auv stralia. The gold obtained from the placers is remarkably pure, being
worth from 817 to 819 per ounce. Many extensive quartz veins bave been discovered, containing free gold. been discovered in considerable abunbeen discovered in considerable abun-
