## PROCEEDINGS OF THE UNION STATE CONVENTION.

Cornallis, March 29 - The vote for Congressman stool, on first ballot, Mallory, 63; Bowlbv. 23; Headerson, 7; B.ker, 23. Wood was nominated for Governor, S. E. May for Secre-tory of State, E. N. Cooke for Treasurer, and W. A. McPherson for State Printer. The ful-

lowing resolutions were adopted :
Resolved, 1st. That we have an abiding confilence in the justice, intelligence and patriotism of the people of the United States, that they have the firmness and wisdom to pre-serve the Union their valor has sustained.

24, As the best plan of restoring the late revolted States to the exercise of all their functions in the Union, and the legislation necessary in relation to freedmen, loyal men may honestly differ. We deprecate that ob-stinacy or pride of opinion, where or by whom displayed, that would give strength to the enemies of the Union, through discord and di-vision among its friends.

3d, Holding the cardinal principle of our Government to be that the right of represen-tation goes with taxation, we desire a full recognition of all civil and political privileges to the inhabitants of the States lately in revolt, as soon as compatible with the national safety and the protection of the loyal people in those States.

4th, The name of the man or of the party that would propose to this nation to regudiare its just pecuniary obligations, should be

consigned to everlasting infamy.

5th, The courage and devot on of those who have borne arms in the cause of the Union, entitle them to our enduring gratitude, and we pledge corselves not to dis-honor them by destroying the principles or surrendering the results for which they fought and bled.

6th. That we will, as we ever have, support the State Governments in all their rights as the most competent administrators of their domestic concerns and the surest breastwork against anti-republican tendencies, and to preserve the General Government in its whole Constitutional vigor.

7th, That the doctrine of nullification and secession, held by the so-called Democratic party, is antagonistic to the perpetuity of the Union and destructive of the peace, order and prosperity of the American people.

Sth. That we pledge ourselves to sustain

the National Union, and to organize for ac tion is carrying out and maintaining these principles, and in support of the candidates nominated by this Convention

9th, We regard any measure which has for its object the taxing or sale of the mineral lands of the United States, that tends to retard or d scourage the free use or occupancy and speedy development of the same, as detrimental to the best interests of the country, and inconsistent with sound national policy; and we respectfully call the attention of our present delegat on in Congress to the subject of this resolution.

PASSING COUNTERFEIT GREENBACKS. A man named David Lindsey was ar-rested a week or more ago, at Strawberry Valley, in El Dorado county, charged with passing counterfeit greenbacks. He has been taken to San Francisco and indicted by the United States Grand Jury. At the time of his arrest be had some fifteen hundred dollars of the spurious currency, in five and ten dollar bills. The counterfeits are well executed, apparently having been printed from the original plates, but the press work is bungingly done, and the whole appearance of the money is coarser than the genuine, but is well calculated to deceive when not seen in comparison with the genuine .- Nevada Daily Gazette.


