CHRISTIAN ANNIVERSARIES -yester. terday was Good Friday. To-morrow will be Easter Sunday. To day is the last of the fast of Lent. The object of Lent, which is a fast of forty days immediately preceding Easter, bus been disputed, but it is generally regarded as a time set apart for repentunce over the sins of the past year, the number of forty days devoted to it is supposed to have reference to the Savior's forty days fast in the wilderness, to the forty days of the Deinge, the forty days granted to the Ninevites for repentance, the forty y ars' wandering of the Jews, or the time spent in fasting by Moses and Elias. The word, it is said by some, is of Saxon origin, and implies Spring, or the season when the days "lengthen;" others that it is of German origin, and implies "thawing." The festival of Easter is called by some writers the "Christian passover." The name is of Teutonic origin, derived from the goddess of Spring, "Ostera," but according to both English and German authors, come from the Saxon. The early Christians differed in regard to the time of celebrating Easter-the churches of the west observing the nearest Sunday to the full moon of Nisan, without taking account of the day on which the passover was celebrated. The Asiatic churches differed materially, and the dispute on this point became serious, when, after many years, the bishop of Rome was appealed to and was very preemptory in requiring the Asiatic Bishops to conform to the rule of the Western church. This they refused to do, and communion between the . wo churches was broken off. After this the question was again discussed, and finally settled for the whole church by adopting the rule which makes Easter day to be always the first Sunday after the full moon which happens upon or next after March 21st, and if the full moon bappens on a Sunday, then Easter day is the Sunday after. By this arrangement Easter may come as early as March 22d, or as late as April 25th. Good Friday is always the last Friday in Lent, and the Friday before Easter Sunday, which will account for its occurrence last year on April 14th, this year on April 1st, and next year on April 19th .- Ore.

INCRNDIARISM.—Two of the old Hudson Bay buildings at this place containing, as we are informed, some eighty or one hunded tons of sheaf oats belonging to the Government, were burned on Sunday eve-Government, were burned on Sunday evening last, and a large shed full of straw on Monday evening. The two fires occurred mearly at the same hour—about nine o'clock, r. M., and appear to us to be acts of premeditated incendiarism. Great pains should be taken to ferret out the perpretrators of such villiany, and to prevent similar cases which it is expected will if not prevented by the vigilance of those whose special duly it is to protect and preserve the property of the Government.— Vancouver Register, March 31st.
