### Epitome of Telegraphic News.

[COMPILED FROM THE OREGONIAN.]

#### DATES TO APRIL 1.

Chicago, March 26 .- The Sen to yesterday was occupied until nearly 6 o'clock, P. M., on the Stockton case, the discussion ending in the passage of a resolution by ayes 22, noes 21, declaring him not cutified to a seat as Secator from New Jersey, whereupon Stock-ton vacated. The Pre ident's veto message was then read, having been previously circu-late! from hand to hand among the Senators and Representatives who crowded the floor.

The Senate now consists of forty-nine members; of whom thirty-one are counted in favor of passing the bill over the veto, and 15 against; three - Dixon, Foote and Wright ansent—sick. An attempt will be made to-day, with every prospect of success. The Secretary of War laid before Congress

an important report of General Pope's on the condition and necessities of his Military Dep riment. He says the protection of trave'ers crossing the plains is a question of absorbing in e.est, and argue: to show the ne-cessity for the speedy completion of the Pa-cific Railroad which will do more than any other single cause to overcome and prevent Indian difficulties. A sufficient number of troops should be stationed along the routes to protect emigration and secure surveying and working parties of the Railroad, and also, when necessary, to render aid in its construction. It would be talse economy to suffer the construction of the roads to be delayed or embarrassed for want of a few troops and the expense they would occasion. Gen. Pope then enters into a long discussion of the various routes to Montaña via Colo rado, New Mexico, etc., and proposes that the Government should restrict itself to one route for furthering that route. He says the present Indian management is growing worse ber of troops that will be required to pre-serve order. He specifies fifty-seven points at each of which there should be a small garrison. The aggregate is twelve regiments of infantry of six thousand effective men and six regiments of cavalry, of three thousand efficient men, and that one-ihird more of each arm of the service should be added for contingencies. The resignation of Gen Geo. W. Palmer, commanding the Department of Kentu ky is accepted. Gen. Jeff. C. Davis succeeds to the command of the Depart-

went.

Workington, March 28.—Sénator Fonte, of Vermout, Senator since 1851, died at four o'clock this morning. The Senate, as a mark of respect, adjourned immediately after the reading of the journal.

The Herald says that the veto exhibits this bill as the most fingrant device for overturn-ing the reserved rights of the States in their legislative and judicial tribunals ever at-tempted in Congress. It appears to be a thousand times more objectional than the freedmen's bill and the veto marks the impassible barrier between the the President and the ruling radicals of Congress. Henceforth, there can be no indorsements of Congress coupled with professions of adherence to the Administration.

The Tribune says : Let us not think that he vetoes the bill he might have phrased differ-ently, but he choses to let us know that not this particular bill, but any measure whereby Gongress shall attempt to protect the blacks against white abuse, must encounter this determined deathly opposition.

gress admits of no compromise.


