THE Diamond Drill is coming into marketfavor. It was originally pat-ented in France by M. Rudolph Leschaud, and subsequently patented in the United States. It can be driven through compact sandstone at the rate five feet per hour. Fifteen diamonds, costing about fifteen hundred dollars, are use instead of steel cutters, and are set in the end of a tub to revolve by machinery. The drill leaves a core at anding, which is broken off at cenvenient length, and drawn up. These diamond cutters last a long time, and the machine is said to be the cheapest in the end.




