## FACTS AND FANCIES.

THE old custom of burning widows in India, has for some time been giving way before an advancing civilization, and the marriage of widows is now allowed. The first, it is believed, which has occurred in the Presidency of Bombay, took place on the 22d of November last, at Bandora.

AN exchange thinks it would be well, before raising expensive monuments to the soldiers who have fallen in the war, that towns and municipalities should see that the widows and children they have left behind are not allowed to starve, or to exist on the merest pittance.

THE "pistologram" is the latest foreign novelty in photography.—The picture is taken by the magnesium light in about three seconds. It is then enclosed between two plates of glass, which are then subjected to such a heat that they become one piece, and the likeness thus becomes hermetically sealed.

THE Australian papers make mention of sudden and intense heat in the middle of November, affecting the health of very many persons. The Melbourne Age says that at Beechworth several animals, principally cats and dogs, died of sun stroke. On the 21st, thermometer reached 133° in the shade.

THE Diamond Drill is coming into market favor. It was originally patented in France by M. Rudolph Leschaud, and subsequently patented in the United States. It can be driven through compact sandstone at the rate five feet per hour. Fifteen diamonds, costing about fifteen hundred dollars, are used instead of steel cutters, and are set in the end of a tub to revolve by machinery. The drill leaves a core standing, which is broken off at convenient length, and drawn up. These diamond cutters last a long time, and the machine is said to be the cheapest in the end.

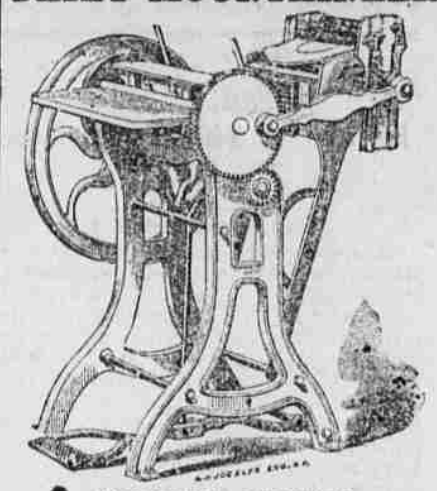
