Washington, April 5—The Supreme Court

has adjourned, having previously ordered that all cases from the lately rebellious States shall be d sposed of at the next term in regular order as, they may stand on the docket. The number of cases finally argued but on which there were no decisions and which are therefore continued till next term, is 15. These include the United States vs. Missouri; the test oath case, and that involving the question of the blockade. In addition to these, the docket contains about 250 other cases.
