The Canyon City Stage is now overdue for five days. It is feared that the Indians have either taken the affair in, driver and all, or have run off some of the stock, preventing the stage from getting the necessary relays.

A GENTLEMAN just arrived from Canyon City informs us that all of the streams on the road are exceedingly high for this season of the year. The last stage seen by our informant was the upgoing stage, somewhere near Bridge Creek; and he thinks that high water is the cause of its non-arrival here.
