New Wesiminister, April 9.—From a reliable miner who arrived at Yale last night from Lytton, we learn that rich bank diggings have been s ruck on Carns' creek, B g Bend. The prospects obtained were so sich as to create exc tement. The discoverer of the diggings immediately proceeded to Ly ton City, where he recorded 18 claims, and he sold 16 ounces of coarse gold which he had taken out, to Messrs Bruic Bros., merchants. Some prospe ting was done in the vicinity of Carns' creek last fall, by a company of Carribooites, of which Bob Nobles was a member They found the diggings were deep, and that they could not get down to bed rock before the winter set in, and being short of provisions they were obliged to leave until spring. The bank diggings were not known last fall, and their discovery cannot fail to be a valuable addition to the p evious discaveri a made in the Big Bend country.
