New York, April 9 .- The Tribune's special dispatch says it is generally expected that the President will in a few days release Jeff. Davis and C. C. Clay on parole.

Six white men charged with the instiga-tion of the negro riot at Alexandria have been convicted and sentenced by a military commission. When the criminals left Alex andria for the Alabama penitentiary, female sympathizers in a large crowd assembled and cheered them off.

St. Louis, April 9 .- The total loss of the steamers and cargoes by fire, last Friday, amounts to about half a million of dollars. The insurance is about four hundred thou-

sand dollars.

New York, April 9:- The steamer New York has arrived from Aspinwall with California mails and treasure.

Wwhington, April 9 -The House galleries were crowded to be fullest c pacity to-day at quarter past one o'clock p. m. The Civil Righ's Bill was taken up for action.
During the morning hour Davis' resolu-

tion, offered January 10th, expressing confidence in the President, came up as unfini-hed business. Raymond, of New York, being entitled to the floor, then moved to postpone the further consideration of the resolution the further consideration of the resolution for two weeks. Agreed to. Boutwell, under the call of States, offered resolutions to the effect that whereas Jeff. Davis, C. C. Clay and others were charged, in the President's proclamation of M y 3d, 1865, upon evidence in the bureau of military justice, with complicity in the murder of President Lincoln, therefore instruction the Judgians. Lincoln, therefore instructing the Jud:clary Committee to inquire if there is probable cause for the charge, and further if there is any probability of their being tried, with power to send for persons and papets.

The Civil Rights bill and the veto mes-

sage were taken up, and it was a quarter past two p m. when the reading was completed. Wilson, of Iowa, after a few remarks, demanded the previous question .-Eldr.dge, of Wisconsin, moved a call of the House, which was declaree not to be in or-LeBlond, of Ohio, moved to lay the bill on the table; negatived, ayes, 39; nays, 124. Eldridge and Fuch made motions to adjourn, which were voted down. Eldridge then announced the secession of indignant members, saying they had left the House on seeing a determination to pass the bill over the veto by the operation of the gag rule. The previous question having been ordered, the vote was taken and resulted as follows: ayes, 235; noes, 18. The Speaker declared the bill had become a law, when tremendous and long continued applause broke forth, followed by hisses. Amid this exe temest the House adjourned.

New York, Ap il 10.—The township elec-

tian in Essex county, yesterday, resulted in Union successes. The Democrats carried only three towns. The board of freeholders which last year was a tie, has ten Republi-

can majority.

Chicago, April 10.—The eight hour bill which was before the Ohio Legislature, failed to become a law, by the negligence of the House to concur in some few trifling amendments made by the Senate. The Legislature has now adjourned.

New York, April 10. - A salute of 100 guns-was fired at Union Square this morning, in honor of the passage of the civil rights bill.
