DATES TO APRIL 12.

Chicago, April 12.—The Wisconsin Legislature, by a strict party vote, except two Republican members in each branch, adopted resolutions declaring that Senator Doan little has betrayed the people of Wisconsin and ought to resign. A resolution approving the President's policy was voted down, without a single Republican vote being given in its favor. The Legislature adjourns today.

The Tennessee House is still at a dead standstill. Speaker Hassell (Conservative) refuses to entertain any motion to refer the credentials of new members to a committee, and insists that those who did not resign but whose seats were declared vacant by the Governor, are still members. If the Speaker votes there will be enough conservatives present for a quorum at any time they choose to withdraw, new radical members having been elected from districts declared vacant by the Governor. The bad blood on both sides presages personal violence. The radicals consider it a life and death struggle. If even now, the whole brawling government goes down.

Washington, April 12.—Judge Underwood, holding a term of the U. S. District Court at Alexandria, yesterday, decided upon application for a writ of habeas corpus, that the President's peace proclamation does not restore that writ.

The President has signed the bill granting the right of way to the Cascade Railroad through the military reservation in Washington Territory.

Chicago, April 12.—Mulligan and Hbray, the Indiana conspirators, have been released from the Ohio penitentiary by the President in consequence of the decision of the U. S. Supreme Court, that their trial by military commission was illegal. They had a reception at the Neil House, Columbus, with much jollification before returning to Indiana. Bowles, released a few days previously, is now stumping Indiana for the Democratic ticket.

Washington, April 12.—President Johnson ordered the suspension of Mayor Monroe and Alderman Nixon of New Orleans until they are pardoned. Acting Mayor Clark continues in office.

Gen. Grant was arrested last Saturday by a policeman on his driving. He was tried today before a Justice of the Peace and paid the fine. Capt. R. B. Winder, imprisoned at Richmond for several months, was discharged today by order from Washington.

The House spent considerable time upon the bill giving army paymasters during the late war a commission of one quarter of one per cent. on all sums disbursed by them, as a compensation for their risks and labors. The measure would require two and a half millions. It met a very general and decided opposition, and probably will never come again to the surface.

The House passed the bill for reimbursing Massac usett. for her militia expenses, amounting to \$671,668.

Chicago, April 12.—The Senate, on Monday, April 9th, passed an act for the appointment of three Commissioners to codify the laws of the United States, each receiving a salary of \$5,000 a year, for not exceeding three years.

In the Senate, Stewart of Nevada, presented a joint resolution proposing to amend the Constitution by prohibiting distinction on account of color, prohibiting the payment of the rebel debt, and providing that when any one of the eleven seceded States shall comply with these conditions, it shall be admitted to representation; referred to the committee of fifteen.

Eulogies of the late Senator Foote were pronounced by V. T. Johnson, of Maryland, Fessenden, of Maine, Sumner, of Massachusetts, Brown, of Missouri, Pomeroy, of Kansas, Orain, of New Hampshire, Chambers, of Vermont, and McDougal, of California, after which the Senate adjourned.

The House during the morning hour, debated the bill for the relief of paymasters of the army, and referred it, together with a resolution calling for information as to how many paymasters are delinquent, to the military committee.

The House passed the Senate bill authorizing the President to sell a gunboat to the Republic of Liberia.

San Francisco, April 13.—No Eastern news today. The steamship Sacramento, from Panama, arrived this morning. On the 24th of March a rebellion occurred at Panama. The conspirators were shot down by the government troops and all their leaders captured.

The Spring term of the Circuit Court for Wasco County will commence tomorrow. The docket comprises fifty two cases, of which 21 are under the 25 law and 6 equity.
