From Canyon City-Mr. Page, Wells, Fargo \& Co.'4 Messenger, ar rived here yesterday :
The treasure box of Well, Fargo \& Co., which was lust some timesince in the South Fork of the Jonn Duy, has been recovered about a mile below the place where it was lost. The box contained $\$ 3,000$ in treasure, beside the letter express.
High water at Canyon City has washed away the greater part of the town, and nining operations on the Creck were entirely suspended. The damage done to the town and mining claitns is very grent.
All the streams between here and Canyon City were swimming. The stago from Caryon City was com. pelled to ntop on the other side of the South Fork, being unable to cross that stream.
The Canyon City Stage Company recovered six of the horses stolen from them nome titne since at Muddy, on the head waters of Crooked Rivor, and it was thought by the men who found the anima's that they would succeed in gotting back sixteen more. Parties are now out, and it is to be hoped that they will find the biding place of the Indians beforo they return.
There is very litile travel on the roat at present, owing to the constant fear of the Indians, who have almost exclusive possession of the country between here and Canyon City.
The people of Canyon City intend to prosent Gen. Halleck witlra medalof what material we havenot learned for the disinterested manner in which he distributes the troops under bis cotnmand. This act on the part of the eitizens of Canyon is deserving of the approbation of all good people. We would suggest to our hemmed up neighbors the propriety of allowing the dear people of the Dalles to "go in with them" in this worthy tribute to a valiant soldier. If the material and size of the medal have not been decided upon, we would recommend that it be manufuctured by our worthy townsman, Tom Calloway, of his best sole leather, the size of a shoemaker's lapstone, and be inseribed ns tollows: "To Maj. Gen. Halleek, from the citizens of Dalles and Canyon Cities, for the impartinl manner in which he distributed the troops under his command to pretect the Chico route, and none other."
