## MONTANA NEWS.

From the Montana Post of March 31st, we condense the following:

A letter dated March 25th, from Mr. John Whittick, of Pipestone District, states that the depth of snow has prevented any great amount of prospecting for some time past, but that some men are looking about the south side of the hills, now. Messrs. Adams, McKistry & Co's mill will be in operation early next week. Shafts forty feet in depth have been sunk on the "Juanita," "Liberty," "Emigrant" and "Philadelphia," which prospect well.

A letter from Deer Lodge, dated March 25th, contains the following matters of interest to the community: "There is but little news here of interest. The weather is fine, and the snow nearly gone of this valley. At Blackfoot the snow is still deep, and very little ground in sight. Snow shoes are still in use; and I do not think that teams will be able to reach Ophir, Washington, Jefferson or McClellan Gulches before May. The people of Blackfoot are in high spirits. They have good mining ground, and plenty of it. Business men are repairing their places handsomely, and property of all kinds is looking up, except goods. Flour \$30 sack; Tobacco \$3 @ \$72 lb ect.

On the 28th ult., Messrs. J. J. Roe & Co. dispatched the steamer Gen Grant, from St. Louis, up the river, for the purpose of picking up the freight dropped at different points, last year, on account of low water, ect.

A correspondent writing from Bannack city, says:

Gulch mining, it is my mature and honest opinion, will be more profitable, this year, than at any previous time since the palmy days of placer mining in Bannack, when one hundred dollars to the pan, and more, was frequently on Jimmy's bar, and fortunes were sluiced out in a few months. Messrs. Smith and Graeter have bought this bar, it being situated near the terminus of the Bannack ditch, of which they are, I believe, the principal stockholders. They intend to put in large flumes, and to sluice the whole thing through. Who would not like a share in that "Golden Fleeco?" Every miner is confident that they have a fortune in this alone, besides the numerous dry gulches west and south of Bannack, which are known to be rich, and will be easily worked when they bring in their new ditch above the head of these places. These enterprising gentlemen have now the best store in Bannack, and are, doubtless, on the high road to wealth and public usefulness.

The creek claims are yet unworked, but have been prospected for six or eight miles, and are known to be rich. Capital and combination are required here, and no individual miner can work his claim on account of the amount of water, which necessitates a system of drainage.

Descending a short distance on the other side, the Blue Wing District is reached. Here a perfect network of silver quartz veins, among which the Haron, Blue Wing, Arizona, Wide West and Silver Rose stand preeminent; simply because shafts have been on them, and their richness has been proved up, and thoroughly tested.

Messrs. Sears and Wright are sinking on the Silver Casket lode, their own discovery, for Mr. Fowler, of New York, who has gone east for a mill and other machinery. This same range of mountains extends to the north to the Rattlesnake District, where the veins again crop out. The lodes at this latter place are very rich in silver and galena. Lieutenant Johnson is still sinking on the Eaton, the ore of which assays very high. The best leads of this district, as far as I know, are the Legal Tender, the White Cloud, the New World, the

Watson and the Dictator; but there are a thousand others just as good. Quite a number of prospectors have been sinking upon their various discoveries during the past winter. They deserve much credit, for their intentions are good "on the face;" and we hope, at no distant day, to see these poor, honest men, richly rewarded. If capitalists would buy from them, instead of purchasing from speculators in "wild-cat," they would never rue their bargain.

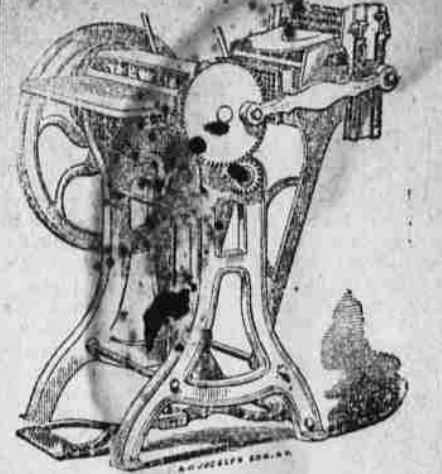
