Gorernment Raform,-Daring the past year much needed reforms bave been introduced into the publie ser, vice. The most important of these, has been the abolishing of the custom of levying tribute upon all employes of the Government for political purposes. The system bas grown up since the days of Jackson, and the extent to which it was oarried during the last few administrations amounted to little less than downight robbery. The salaries and pay of many of the em. ployes io the San Francisco Custom House were searcely sufficient for their support, and yet they were rer quired under penalty of losing their places, to give a certain proportion of their pay as a fund for political pur poses. The tax was not only levied upon the fow receiving large salaries, but also upon the many mechanics and laborers in the navy yards and custom houses. This system of robbery has been nearly, if not entirely, stopped within the past year, greatly to the disgust of professional patriots; and the politician is no longer allowed to collect the tax in the Government offices, with the power of decapitating those who refused to pay. Not long since, the Commissioner of Internal Revenue attempted to have a clerk in the Pay master's Department removed because be refused to contribute money for electioneering purposes in New Hampşire. The President, how ever when informed of the fact, not only ordered the elerk to be retained, but that he should be promoted the first opportunity. This was a wise and a just act on the part of the Pres. ident, and a proper rebuke to the offlcial who attempted to use his position to extort a tax from a subordinate for electioneering purposes.
The Cholrba.-Hall's Journal Health gives the following suggetions, which deserve the immediate attention of all who wish to avoid the scourge of eholera, which threatens to attack us :
1st. Evary househulder owes it to himself, to his family, to his neighbors, to tho commanity in which he resides, to have his house, from cellar to garret, frome street curb to the rear line of bis tot, most sorupulously cleansed, by sweeping, washing and whitewasbing.
