

THE LAST MOMENTS OF SENATOR FOOT.-The Washington correspondent of the Alta California thus depicts the scene at the death-bed of Senator Foot of Vermont.

His illness was of about six weeks' duration, but up to a week ago, hopes were entertained of his recovery. His death-bed was that of a nobleman and a Christian. At about 7 o'clock on Wednesday morning, as if admonished by some invisible attendant that his moments were few, he signified bis desire to see once more the light of the sun in heaven, and the capital on which it shone, and where he had so long served the people of his State and country, and where his associates would soon again assemble. They lift ed him up, but his eyes were already dim, and he sank back upon his pillow. Seeing his time was at hand, the words of the 28d Psalm were read, and a colemn prayer went up from the lips of one, the dearest to him on carth. He called her to hisside, tolded her in his arms for a moment, then, as his breathing became choked. he said : "What! can this be death ? Is it come already ?" Then, lying a few moments longer, with eyes all fall of celestial radiance, he litted his hands and looked up exclaiming: "I see it! I see it! The gates are wide open ! beautiful!" and without a movement or pang, immediately ex-pired. His death has cast a gloom over Congress, and this community, where he was held in high estimation for his many admirable traits of obarncter.




