## Epitome of Telegraphic News.

[COMPILED FROM THE OREGONIAN.]

### DATES TO MAY 31.

New York, May 21.—The Panama Star and Herald extra, of May 13th, has the following: "The United States flag ship Vanderbilt and monitor Monadnock arrived in the harbor of Panama on the evening of May 12th, having left Callao on the 3d. From these vessels we have news of the bombardment of Callao and the result. The action commenced at noon from the shore batteries, the fire being returned by the Ville de Madrea and Bianca on the northern side of the harbor, and the Numancia, Resolucion and Alamanza on the south. The Ville de Madrea and Berenguela were badly damaged early in the fight, and they were obliged to withdraw to San Lorenzo, and were afterwards followed by the Numancia and the rest of the fleet. All were more or less damaged, and the Spanish Admiral was said to be badly wounded. During the fight Senor Galvez, the Peruvian Secretary of War, was killed by an explosion in the battery. The fight lasted till 4 o'clock P. M., when it was terminated by the withdrawal of the Spanish fleet. Very little damage was done to Callao. A few hundred dollars worth of property was destroyed, and ten Peruvians reported killed and wounded.

Nothing reliable has been heard of the loss of the fleet, but it was supposed to be heavy. It was not known whether the Spaniards would resume the attack, but it was supposed they would not at present. The Spanish defeat was received at Panama with great enthusiasm. Advice from Valparaiso to the 18th of April, report that the blockade has been raised and that the Chilean Government have in force the import and export duties existing before the blockade. Market dull.

Washington May 21.—In the Senate, Wilson, from the Military Committee, reported the bill creating the grade of General.

Wilson offered a resolution, which was adopted, directing the Judiciary Committee to inquire into and report as to the expediency of adopting a uniform mode of electing U. S. Senators by Legislatures.

In the House, McRuer introduced a joint resolution authorizing increased pay for letter carriers in San Francisco. The resolution was referred to the Postoffice Committee.

Hitchcock, of Nebraska, introduced a bill creating Omaha and Nebraska City ports of entry. Referred to the Committee on Commerce.

WHO SHALL WEAR THE BREECHES?—Judge Rix, of San Francisco, lately sentenced the perambulating Docress DeWolf to pay \$21 or go to jail ten days, for wearing breeches when walking the streets with DeWolf himself. The odd dollar was thrown in to enable the advocates of affinities, etc., to appeal the case to the County Court, where they propose to test the question whether a married woman has or has not the right to wear the breeches if she sees fit, and her husband don't object.

Mr. Geo. G. Gibson and his son Samuel, met with a severe accident, on Thursday, while taking down a barn frame on their farm, 1 1/2 miles above Salem, in Polk county. They were engaged in taking off the plates of the building, when the frame fell with them, breaking three ribs of Mr. Gibson, and injuring him otherwise internally.—Samuel escaped with a severe sprain of one wrist and ankle.
