Ordinance No. 39.

AN ORDINANCE to License Hotel and Steamboat Runners.

The people of Dalles City do ordain as follows: Section 1. Any person who shall solicit patronage for a Hotel or Steamboat, commonly called a "Runner," within the corporate limits of Dalles City, shall thereupon procure a License from the Recorder, and shall pay therefor into the city treasury the sum of Ten Dollars for every three months.
