A NEW INVESTION. -The San Francisco Call enys that & man named E T. Barlow, living in San Franci co, has invented a little machine for nailing boot and shoe heels and soles, and is more surprising to its operations and destined to be quite as useful in its way as the sewing machine. This new machine makes nails and drives them home at one motion, and with it a man can easily make and drive one hundred and sixty nails in a minute. The machine "jegs" the nails, points them, beads, drives them home, and clinches them, all at one motion. An entire machine will not weigh to exceed ten pounds, and it can be readily adjusted so as to cut nails from two leches in length down to the thrirty-second part of an inch. It can be used for riveting belts, or for any other purpose where nalls are driven into leather ; in fact it is difficult to say where it cannot be used. The invention is well worthy of general attention, and will create a great revolution in the boot and shoe business.

Ordinance No. 39.

AN ORDINANCE to License Hotel and steamboat Runners.

Secricy 1. Any person who shall solicit patronage for a Hotel or Stewnboxt, com nonly called a "Runner," within the corporate limits of Dalies City, shall therefor procure a License from the Recorder, and shall pay therefor into the city treasury the sum of Ten Dollars for every three months.

Sac. 2. Any person who shall do business as a runner, who by malicious misrepresentations shall injure, or a tempt to injure any Hitel, Restaurant or stoambout, shall, on conviction thereof, be punished by a fine in any sum not exceeding twenty dollars for each and every offense.

Sac. 3. Any person who shall do business as a runner without procuring a license therefor, shall, on conviction thereof, be punished by a fi e in the sum of twenty

dollars.
SEC. 4. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the 2d day of June, 1869.
