EASTERN NEWS.

Washington, May 21.—The whiskey and tobacco interests are represented almost daily before the Ways and Means Committee. The delegates representing the whiskey distillers are urging the reduction of the tax to one dollar per gallon on distilled spirits. They claim that the manufacturers and Government would be largely benefited.

Washington, May 22.—In the Senate, Mr. Williams, of Oregon, introduced a bill granting lands to aid the construction of a railroad and telegraph from Salt Lake to the Columbia river. The bill opening the public lands of Alabama, Mississippi, Arkansas and Florida to settlement under the Homestead laws, without regard to color, and extending the act to late rebels who take the oath of allegiance, was debated and passed. Mr. Sherman spoke for two hours in advocating the bill for consolidating the national debt.

The House passed the Bankruptcy bill reported last Thursday—the bill reported by a select committee, and which differs from the former bill only in some slight particulars—yeas, 69, nays, 57.

The House had an elaborate debate on the tobacco tax, and agreed on the following rates: On cavendish plug and twist, 60 cents per pound; on fine, 40 cents; cigars \$4 per thousand, and 40 per cent. ad valorem; provided, the first ten dollars valuation be not abated.

Washington, May 23.—The Senate took up the reconstruction question. Mr. Sumner of Mass., urged delay, declaring the country had gained much by postponement already. Mr. Fessenden, of Maine, and Mr. Conness of California, opposed postponement. Mr. Howard, of Michigan, opened the debate, speaking two hours in defense of the plan as reported by the committee. Several amendments were offered, and ordered printed.

Washington, May 23.—Dr. George Cooper, post surgeon at Fortress Monroe, reports the result of the medical examination of Jeff. Davis, made in compliance with the instructions of the President. He says, Davis is considerably emaciated and his nervous system greatly deranged. Want of sleep has been the great and almost the principal cause of his nervous excitement. This is produced by the tramp of sentinels, and the guard relief almost invariably awakes him. He has scarcely enjoyed two hours of unbroken sleep since his confinement. Precautions have been taken by the surgeon by placing matting along the sentry walks to alleviate this source of disturbance but only with partial success.

SINGULAR, IF TRUE.—One of our exchanges says there is a young man in Vermont who cannot speak to his father! Previous to his birth some difference arose between his mother and her husband, and for a considerable time she would not speak to him. The difficulty was subsequently healed—the child was born, and in due time began to talk; but when sitting with his father was invariably silent. It continued so till it was five years old, when the father, after having exhausted his powers of persuasion, threatened it with punishment for its stubbornness. When the punishment was inflicted it elicited nothing but sighs and groans, which told but too plainly that the little sufferer was vainly endeavoring to speak. All who were present united in the opinion that it was impossible for the child to speak to his father, and time proved their opinion to be correct. At a mature age its effort to converse with its parent could only produce the most bitter sighs and groans.
