than one, nor more than threa years. That all white male inbabitants age of twenty-one years, who shalt ha
sided within this State for six month preceding an election, or bave declared thei intention to bocome citizens of the Unired States according to the provisions of the con-
stitution, stiall be entitled to vote for Presidential electors, Representatives to Congress
State, di-triet and precinct officers. Provided That nine y days bona fideresidence in a county next preceding an election shall be required
to entitle a person to vote for connty and
precinct officers, nud likewise ninety precinct officers, nad likewise ninety days
preceding such election in a district for dis. preceding suc
trict officurs.
