EASTERN NEWS.

Washington, May 28th.—In the Senate, Wilson of Massachusetts, Henderson of Missouri, Van Winkle of West Virginia, Johnson of Maryland and Buckalew of Pennsylvania were appointed a special committee to investigate the condition of the National Banks.

The Senatorial caucus renewed its sessions this morning and also in the evening. There was a full attendance but no vote was taken or any definite conclusion reached, the various Senators having previously expressed their views on the reconstruction programme. Fessenden of Maine, Howard of Michigan and Grimes of Iowa were appointed a committee to draft the report on the same. Neither Doolittle of Wisconsin, Dixon of Connecticut nor Cowan of Pennsylvania were invited to attend the caucus.

It seems to be the well settled opinion in official quarters, that Davis' trial will be postponed till next October. There seems to be good authority for denying the statement which has been published, that a new indictment against Davis has been drawn up in the Attorney General's office since Speed's return to Washington and that Judge Underwood's indictment would be quashed. It is not improbable, however, that some changes will be made in the indictment presented by the Norfolk Grand jury. Mrs. Davis has been in receipt of a large number of calls today. The President has granted her permission to remain with her husband at Fortress Monroe. Burton Harrison, Davis' Private Secretary also arrived to-night in company with one of Davis' counsel.

San Francisco, May 31.—About 8 1/2 o'clock last evening the Steamship *Orizaba* lying at Pacific street wharf was discovered to be on fire and alarm was immediately sounded. The flames soon burst up through the hatchways, enveloping that portion of the ship in a sheet of flame. The Department was promptly on hand and through their extraordinary exertions the flames were driven back to the hold and in about an hour were entirely extinguished. Contrary to the expectations of nearly every one, the ship sustained comparatively slight injuries. The damage does not exceed \$1,500 to \$2,000. The fire caught in the engine room, amidships, but how is not known. The ship caught fire Tuesday after noon but broke out afresh last night.

The court is engaged in the investigation of charges and counter charges growing out of the squatter troubles in the western addition, in which Duane, Ross and others were engaged, and which led to the shooting of Ross by Duane. The charge of murder has been set for next Thursday, at half past one o'clock, p. m. The Duane's are in court to-day, listening to testimony and making suggestions in the matter to their counsel.
