Chicago, June 1 .- The Fenians invaded Canada la t night, crossing Ningara river tour unites below B dfalo, about 1 500 strong, and were to-day intrenching themselves to attack. They are commanded by Col. H. R. Stagg and Col. O'Neil, the latter from Nashville, Tennessee. The troops comprise vol-unteers from the West and Northwest, and the crossing was effected by steam thes and canal boats. Great excitement prevails in Buffalo and Canada West, and reports indicate a movement by the Fenians from Roches-rer, Buffalo and other land points on a large scale to join forces in Canada. Reports also indicate large bodies of Fenians at St. Albans. and points along the St. Lawrence river. threatening a similar invasion, and reinforcements are moving from Boston, New York and the Eastern States to assist Gen. Sweeney. This Fenian army of invasion is under the anspices of R berts and in defines of the organizer, Stephens, whose counsels they

Dispatches from Toronto represent active milliary preparations to punish the invaders. The Canadian Government has taken pa-session of the railroads and telegraph, and having a large force of well organize I militia at command besides regular troops, will make short work of this invasion. The U.S. troops East and We t are being sent to the bo der in deta hments sufficient it is hoped to prevent another breach of neutrality.

The indians on the Owyhee, ten days since, killed twenty-seven Chinamen and two Americans, and a day or two afterwards, killed two citizens and six soldiers at Owyhee Ferryboth transactions being on the Halleck Chico route. The news came by letter yesterday Yours, etc., VIATOR. and is reliable.

Ordinance No. 39.

AN ORDINANCE to License Hotel and steamboat Runners. The people of Dalles City do ordain as follows:

Secretarian 1. Any person who shall solicit patronage for a Hotel or Statubout, commonly called a "Bunner," within the corporate limits of Dalles City, shall therefor procure a Licanse from the Recorder, and shall nay therefor into the city treasury the sum of Ten Dollars for every three months.

SEC. 2. Any person who shall do business as a runner, who by malicious misrepresentations shall injure, or a tempt to injure any Hotel Restaurant or steambout, shall, on conviction thereof, be punished by a fine in any sum not exceeding twenty dollars for each and every offense.

SEC. 3. Any person who shall do business as a runner without procuring a license therefor, shall, on convic-tion thereof, be punished by a file in the sum of twenty

dollars.
Sec. 4. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the 21 day of June, 1836.
