MAXIMILIAN'S EUROPEAN HOME .- A writer in Blackwood's Magazine thus describes Maximilian's home in the Adriatio:

" On a grand bold bluff over the Adriatic stands one of the most picturesque chateaux I ever beheld, almost covering the plateau, save where a little space is stolen from the projecting arm of the building for a flow-er knot or a fountain. It displays all that can be accomplished by irregular outline and varied color. Tower and minaret and buttress, projecting window and deep shadowing cornice, with ornamented architrave and stained glass, have done their very best, and made one the most delightful houses to live in, and one of the handsomest to look at, in Europe. Splendid gardens lie to the rear backed by a noble forest, stretching away to the foot of a moun-

This elegant establishment was built by Maximilian, who lavished upon it all the resources which wealth and refined taste could command to make it an earthly paradise; yet he has left this scene of peaceful enjoyment for the cares and dangers of imperial life among a hostile people. It is only an other illustration of the restlessness of man, and the folly of preferring shadow to substance and empty honor to substantial comfort."

BEAUTIFY YOUR HOMES .- Nothing so unerringly shows a man's character and tastes, as his house and its surroundings, when they come under his direct supervision. The man who builds an ungainly house and pays no attention to its outside appearance, or internel arrangements is of a coarse, uncultivated nature; while he who displays taste in these matters, has at least shown refinement, and the prob, ability is, that his whole nature is of similar texture. Every one who has a home of his own should pride him-self on its appearance. If it's nothing but a shapty, cleanliness and the exer-cise of a little taste will have wonder ful effect in removing anything re-pulsive from it, and a very little labor tastily bestowed in cultivating a few ornamental vines or shrubs, will render it absolutely attractive. A cotem-porary says, "The planting of fruit trees and vines is a cheap operation, and every one should plant his yard with some one or other of the beautiful varieties of the trees of our woods before it is too late." How beautiful does a well shaded homestead look compared with the hot, dusty, naked premises of the idle and lazy. Plant trees, plant vines, cover your yards with the shade of the peach, plum and grape vine, and save in comfort and pocket thereby.
