WAR MAKES BIG TENT CITY IN ILLINOIS

(By United Press to the Bend Bulletin)
GREAT LAKES, Ill., April 21.—Born of patriotism and nourished by war, this town of Great Lakes bids fair to soon become the greatest naval recruit mobilization point in the world.

Before the outbreak of hostilities with Germany, there were several hundred "rookies" at the naval training station here. They flocked in at the rate of more than 100 a day

until now a population of 20,000 is soon expected.

The government obtained use of 157 acres on each side of the original station, to accommodate the crowds of youths that swarmed to enlist. A new city of tents sprang up. Now government engineers are preparing to drain a new tract, where more tents will be pitched. It was even necessary to cover the parade ground

FILES AFFIDAVIT

State of Oregon,
County of Deschutes, ss.
I, Fred N. Van Matre, of Bend, Oregon, being first duly sworn, depose and say that I have read in the newspapers and heard otherwise, statements to the effect that in a public trial of Frank Sheffield for "bootlegging," my name was mentioned in the testimony in such way as to give the impression that I was associated with the said Sheffield in his illegal acts; that, as a matter of fact, I never received from said Sheffield, directly or indirectly, any intoxicating liquor whatsoever, nor did I know or have reason to believe that he was handling or disposing of such liquor, though on a recent occasion I did see him in an intoxicated condition and warned him to keep off the street—the only time I ever spoke to the man; that I never received from him any package whatsoever, containing liquor or anything else,
