JUNEAU, April 23.—Three mines of the famous Treadwell group are practically unworkable, as the result of a cave-in admitting the waters from the Gastineau channel. The lower workings are flooded, and miners narrowly escaped with their lives as the waters rushed in. The mines are richest in Alaska.

GIVES BIG ORDER

PORTLAND, Or., April 23.—A really tremendous equipment order, the magnitude and importance of which it is difficult for the average mind to grasp, is that made a few days ago by the Union Pacific System for locomotives.
