Stewart, as I am informed and verily believe, and therefore state, has wholly abandoned said claim for upwards of five years last past and has never resided upon, or cultivated said tract, or any portion thereof, that said absence from the land was not due to his employment in military service rendered in connection with operations in Mexico or along the borders thereof or in mobilization camps elsewhere, in the military or naval organizations of the United States or the National Guard of any of the several States.
