HOME PRODUCTS WEEK IS BEGUN

PEOPLE URGED TO PURCHASE OREGON MADE CHRISTMAS PRESENTS — WOULD ADD TO FINANCIAL POWER OF STATE.

Home Products Week begins today. From this morning until Saturday night, the people of Oregon are expected to remember Home Industries in their buying.

Official recognition of Home Products Week was made when Governor Withycombe issued his proclamation, so designating the week of December 3 to 8, and every Oregonian is urged to "Buy at least one Christmas present which is an Oregon product."

That seems a modest request, but it only serves to show what Oregonians have in their power to do for Oregon, if they will. Probably 500,000 people in Oregon are old enough to be buying Christmas pres-

ents this year. Suppose we take a modest average of one silver dollar for a Christmas gift, and think what this means. With five hundred thousand people responding to this call, with an average expenditure of only one dollar, it means half a million dollars kept in Oregon in this instance alone. If a one dollar response to the Home Industry appeal can keep half a million dollars in Oregon, it dazzles the imagination to think what a power the people of our state have in their daily possession, to make Oregon grow and prosper by patronizing home industries.

Millions of dollars a month that leave Oregon could be kept in the state for the people of Oregon to spend over and over again with each other.

Millions of Oregon money finds its way into the pay rolls of eastern factories every month, yet there is not an Oregonian but who will speak with pride of the great resources of our state. It needs no political economist to understand how our cities and towns would increase in population—how the farmers would have nearer and bigger markets for their products—if the millions of money that Oregon supplies each month for eastern payrolls were spent for Oregon products, thus keeping the money
