shot in the hip. Upon his return to his regiment it was moved to the Somme. At Regina trench, the officer was wounded for the last time and permanently retired from active service. The price he paid was the loss of both arms, torn off by high explosives. He was recommended for the military cross in October, 1916, and received special mention in dispatches by Sir Douglas Haig.

Gook In Gas Attack.
Captain E. J. Gook entered service with the Western Canadian cavalry, enlisting in August, 1914. At Festubert, in an assault on German third-line trenches, Captain Gook stopped two soft-nosed machine gun bullets, which entered his right side and traversed the stomach. Contrary to all the predictions, he recovered. It was also his fortune to be "gassed" at the second battle of Ypres. The full complement of his wounds includes one in the left elbow.

is survived by two sons and a daughter.

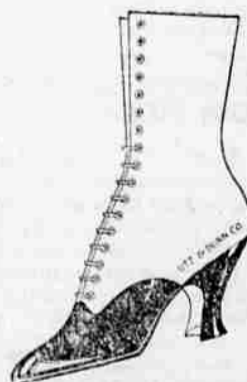

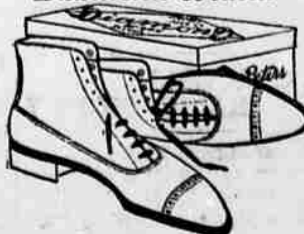
