ton where they will spend the Christmas holidays.

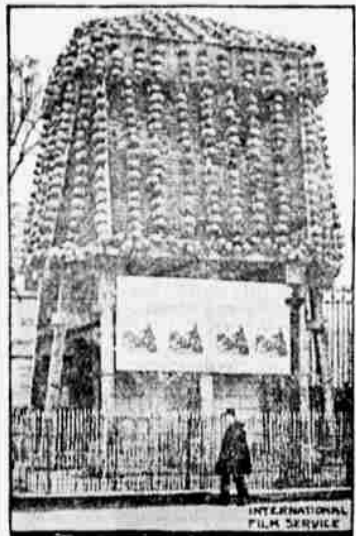
Hugh Thompson, who has been attending the University of Oregon at Eugene, is spending the holidays with his parents in this city.
