wheelbarrow race—on deck. Three times round the deck is a mile and the 100-yard dash took less than a third of the deck. The crew had the time of their young lives.

"We are not sure yet how the rest of the trip to Constantinople will be made—whether by another transport around or by rail down through France and then by water.

"It was rumored that the Astor yacht was at Brest and to be taken to Constantinople by part of this crew and our party to go with it. Since then we hear we may go by hospital train down through France.

"It has been a very enthusiastic trip, or crowd, and very little seasickness. This goes right back on the Leviathan and will reach Oregon about the time we hope to get to Constantinople."

Notice is hereby given that at the school district bond election hereby called to be held at Kenwood School, in and for School District No. 1 of Deschutes County, Oregon, on Saturday, the 29th day of March, A. D. 1919, between the hours of two o'clock p. m. and seven o'clock p. m., there will be submitted to the legal voters thereof the question of contracting a bonded indebtedness in the sum of twenty-eight thousand (\$28,000) dollars for the purpose of providing funds with which to erect and furnish a school building in and for said school district.
