NITROGEN FORMING BACTERIA ORDERED

Ranchers Advised to Inoculate Soil at Same Time That Acreage Is Sown to Alfalfa.

The biggest order for cultures of nitrogen forming bacteria ever placed with the Oregon Agricultural college has just been sent in from Bend, R. A. Ward, of the First National bank, stated this morning. The order is based on the acreage provided for in the bank's recent order of 26,000 pounds of Grimm alfalfa seed for 203 Central Oregon farmers.

Mr. Ward advises that ranchers sowing alfalfa inoculate the soil with bacteria at the same time, to insure good stands of the forage plant. The bacteria will be furnished at cost by the agricultural college, so that the expense of inoculation per acre will be about 4 cents.

There will probably be a sufficient supply to take care of the wants of other farmers than those who ordered seed, and all desiring bacteria are requested to communicate with Mr. Ward.

SCHOOL DISTRICT BOND ELECTION NOTICE

STATE OF OREGON, County of Deschutes, School District No. 1.

Notice is hereby given that at the school district bond election hereby called to be held at Kenwood School, in and for School District No. 1 of Deschutes County, Oregon, on Saturday, the 29th day of March, A. D. 1919, between the hours of two o'clock p. m. and seven o'clock p. m., there will be submitted to the legal voters thereof the question of contracting a bonded indebtedness in the sum of twenty-eight thousand (\$28,000) dollars for the purpose of providing funds with which to erect and furnish a school building in and for said school district.

The vote to be by ballot upon which shall be the words "Bonds—Yes" and "Bonds—No"; and the voter shall place a cross (X) between the word "Bonds" and the word "Yes" or between the word "Bonds" and the word "No" which indicates his choice.

The polls for the reception of the ballots cast for or against the con-

traction of said indebtedness will, on said day and date and at the place aforesaid be opened at the hour of two o'clock p. m. and remain open until the hour of seven o'clock p. m. on the same day when the same shall be closed.

NOTICE TO TAXPAYERS.

Taxes for the current year will now shortly be due.

In paying taxes look up the description of the property on which you wish to pay taxes. After you have paid the taxes verify the descriptions on the tax receipt with your deed records. The tax records go through many hands while in preparation and mistakes are possible.

April 5 is the last date on which the first half of the 1919 taxes can be paid without interest.

October 5 is the last date on which the second half of the 1919 taxes can be paid without interest.

Interest shall be charged on any tax or half of a tax not paid when due at the rate of one per cent, per month or fraction of a month until paid.

All taxes not paid by the 5th day of October become delinquent and on November 5 a penalty of 5 per cent, is charged and collected in addition to the interest.

The attention of taxpayers is also called to the provisions of the law making it their duty to keep the tax collector of the county informed of their true and correct address.
