without leave, traveled to the front, attached himself to a unit about to go into action and found a job as machine gunner in a "whippet" tank during the operations in the Argonne.

**Is Awarded Palm.**

When the tractor was stalled driver and gunner pried off their machine gun, filled their gas mask covers with ammunition, and picking out an advanced position, held it until evening, when Likens' companion was killed. Then Likens retired, picking up a wounded man on his way back. On December 25, he was awarded the croix de guerre and palm, and was kissed by six French commanders. He was gassed and sustained fractures of the skull, leg and shoulder while in action.

Sergeant Bates, who enlisted from Roseburg, told graphically of the horrors of the battlefield, and urged liberal support of the Victory loan as an expression of appreciation of the sacrifices made by the men overseas.

**Hartwig Speaks.**

Otto Hartwig, president of the State Federation of Labor, contrasted labor conditions in America and Germany, and declared that organized labor would not be found wanting when Victory bonds are offered to the people. Mr. Hartwig, while the war was on, endeavored three times to enlist for foreign service, but was of so much value to the government in straightening out labor difficulties which were hampering war work that he was not permitted to go.

Among the other speakers were O. W. Taylor and John F. Daly of Portland and Captain Crumpacker, B. F. Irvine of the Oregon Journal and E. E. Brodie of the Oregon City Enterprise were also on the train.
