EIGHTH GRADE TESTS WILL BE HELD SOON

Examination Papers Received by County Superintendent, Together with Naturalization Books.

Eighth grade examination questions have been received by County School Superintendent J. Alton Thompson, and will be sent out to the various districts in time for the annual tests, which will be held on May 15 and 16. Mr. Thompson has also received state library lists, from which the county schools may make their selection of books.

In line with the school work recently taken up in co-operation with the naturalization bureau, a number of students' text books on naturalization have been sent to the superintendent's office, and any prospective citizens who have made application for these are requested to call for them. Together with the text books are a number of teachers' manuals having to do with the same subject.
