##### GRAND.

Love of mother and sons, wife and husband, woman and orphaned children, love of country and almost every element of the better side of human life--things that appeal to the deeper emotions--have been

interwoven into the plot of "The Heart of Humanity," the magnificent story-spectacle to be shown at the Grand theater at Sunday matinee, Sunday, Monday and Tuesday evenings.

This is the picture which has been hailed by New York critics as one ranking with "The Birth of a Nation" in appeal and destined to live with it in popularity.

"The Heart of Humanity" is a story of war. There's no use camouflaging on that. But while its war is as spectacular as anything Griffith has ever done--Allan Holubar has surpassed Griffith in this respect--it's a story of humanity, graphically visualizing the effect of war on the folks at home with war's harvest of widows and orphans.

This picture is an eulogy of sacrificing womanhood of the free world, the mothers who gave their sons freely to save the world from the Hun, and the wives who just as willingly placed arms in the husbands' hands. At the same time, it pays

tribute to the men who thought not of life when the call of their country came.

Dorothy Phillips, who has appeared in some of the most successful pictures in the past few years, is the leading figure in "The Heart of Humanity." She's the little Canadian backwoods girl who gives her husband to the army and then, answering the call of the orphaned of Belgium, invades the battlefield to minister to them under the Red Cross. William Stowell, Robert Anderson, Margaret Mann and Eric von Stroheim, who has a record for screen villainy that will hold for many a day, are other figures in this drama of life and death.

The story moves from the pine forests of the Canadian northwest to the fields of Flanders, with flashes of humor, bits of pathos, merciless deeds of the Hun--all dominated by the crash of the big guns.

Tonight Constance Talmadge will be seen in "The Honeymoon." "The Honeymoon" is a story of a jealous little girl who nearly wrecked her honeymoon just 15 minutes after the ceremony was over. In fact, her honeymoon was full of trials.

##### LIBERTY.

Sheila Moore, the daughter of a vaudeville actor who finds it difficult to earn a livelihood, determines to go upon the stage, but is told by the manager to whom she applies for an engagement that her work was the poorest he had seen in many years. Thus, without employment and little to eat, Sheila becomes a clerk in the fashionable Ballantyne chocolate shop, where she meets Tom, the son of her employer. He becomes infatuated with Sheila and without realizing that she is marrying a mere boy, she finally becomes his wife. Her father, as well as the Ballantynes, are shocked at the news, and the young bridegroom is obliged by his father to go to work for a living. The bride becomes in effect a ward of Ballantyne, Sr., and when a friend of her husband, who knows nothing of the marriage, makes violent love to her, she resents his course vigorously. She faints in his arms just as her husband appears on the scene, the result being a family quarrel which ends in Sheila quitting the Ballantyne home in anger. Tom then realizes that he has lost something and his chase of his vanished bride, the reconstruction of ideas on the part of some of the family and the repentance of certain sinners,

concludes an interesting story. Such is Dorothy Gish in "The Hope Chest." This feature will be seen at the Liberty Friday, Saturday matinee and evening. Tonight will be featured the opening episode of "The Man of Might," featuring William Duncan. Frank McIntyre will also appear in "The Traveling Salesman," the story of a drummer who woke up a sleepy town.
