

WARNING TO AUTOMOBILE OWNERS

CITY OF BEND ORDINANCE NO. 27

Section 1. Every automobile or motor driven vehicle when driven upon the streets, alleys or public ways within the corporate limits of the City of Bend shall, during the hours of darkness, have fixed upon some conspicuous part thereof at least two lighted lamps, both showing a white light to the front.

Section 2. Every automobile or motor driven vehicle shall use the "muffler," so-called, and the same shall not be cut out or discontinued when the motor of any of the said vehicles is in operation within the corporate limits of the City of Bend. Every automobile or motor driven vehicle shall be provided with good and efficient brakes. The driver or operator of every automobile or motor driven vehicle shall turn to the right in meeting vehicles, teams or persons moving or headed in an opposite direction and by turning to the left in passing vehicles, teams or persons moving or headed in the same direction.

WARNING IS HEREBY GIVEN THAT AUTOMOBILE DRIVERS MAY HAVE UNTIL JULY 28 TO EQUIP THEIR CARS SO AS TO COMPLY WITH THE FOREGOING ORDINANCE AND THAT AFTER JULY 28 SAID ORDINANCE WILL BE STRICTLY ENFORCED.

LEGAL NOTICES

NOTICE TO IRRIGATORS AND OTHERS.

Chapter 425 of the General Laws of Oregon, for 1919, effective on and after June 2, 1919, makes it a misdemeanor for anyone to permit waste water to flow upon a public road or county highway. The following is the text of the act:

"Section 1. Any person or persons or corporation occupying land as owner, proprietor, lessee or otherwise, who willfully or negligently permits any water from any irrigation or drainage ditch to waste or flow from the lands or premises owned, occupied, leased or rented by him, upon any county road or public highway, or upon the right of way of any public road or county highway, and damage the same, or interfere with the public use thereof, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be punished by a fine not to exceed \$100, or imprisonment in the county jail not to exceed sixty days, or by both such fine and imprisonment. Justice courts shall have concurrent jurisdiction with the circuit courts of all offenses committed under this act."

Any person desiring to run irrigation water across any county road should apply to the county court for a permit.

It is also unlawful to throw or deposit any glass or foreign substance upon any county road.

The county court of Deschutes county has directed me to enforce the above laws and violators will be prosecuted. Names and addresses of violators are requested.

Your committee on streets, public ways and sewers having been instructed by you to view the location of the proposed west central main and sewer laterals No. 44, No. 45 and No. 46, same extending as follows: That on the eleventh day of July, 1919, they viewed and examined the locations of the aforesaid proposed sewers and duly considered the maps, report and estimates of the city engineer on the same and they have ascertained and determined that the four proposed sewers above mentioned are of such a nature and so related that in all respects they should be considered as single projects and that the benefits to be enjoyed by all property served by the same is equal for any tracts or lots of equal area; and that all property which is herein declared to be benefited by the proposed sewers shall be assessed in proportion to the area thereof, and further that the property which is deemed to be benefited by the proposed sewers and to be assessed to defray the cost of
