derstorm visited Portland this morning. Claps of thunder were frequent. Phenomena of the kind are of rare occurrence here.


Lightning struck the steel bridge putting the draw out of commission and forcing ships to stay in their berths. A flagpole was splintered. Rain fell in torrents for a short time.
