the other that of scraping the bottom as the lake dries up in the summer, by this means securing a mixture of potassium nitrate, sodium nitrate, sodium bicarbonate, and common salt, which is left almost free from impurities in a layer from a quarter to a half an inch deep as the water recedes in the summer. If the latter system is followed, it is probable that the crude salts would be brought to
