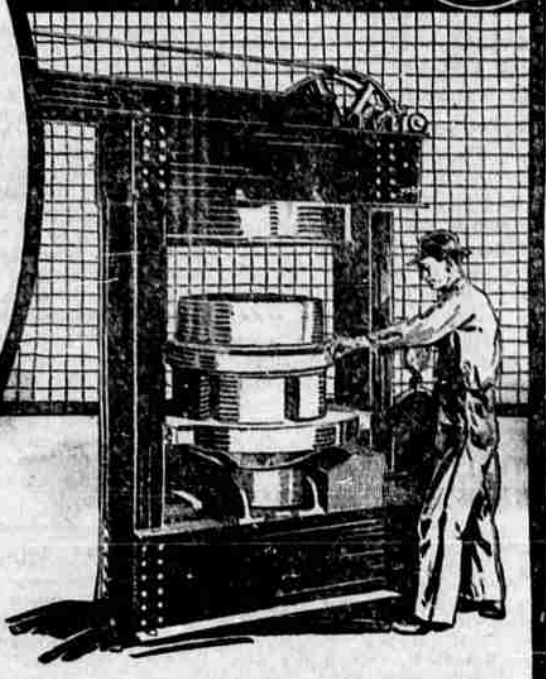

OCT. 5-6 TUMALO FAIR DATES; LIVESTOCK TO BE FEATURE

October 5 and 6 are the dates set for the annual West Side Agricultural Fair, to be held in Tumalo.

With a better year, with more farmers producing more and better crops, with livestock they are happy to display, the farmers are looking keenly forward to something in the nature of a real treat for Central Oregon lovers of fine livestock, vegetables, grains, grasses, foods and needle work.

The livestock of the county will come into its own at this year's exhibit. For the first time there has been set aside a separate department for the exhibition of pure-bred livestock. With greater interest in the last year in the improvement of their herds the farmers are anxious to display what can be done with purebred stock as opposed to scrub stock. It is expected that there will be more than 35 exhibitors of purebred livestock, in which event this will be the largest display of livestock ever shown in Deschutes county.

Boys and Girls Interested.
The Boys and Girls Clubs will have their place in the livestock features of the fair. There are

more than 43 pig club members in the county, of which a majority belong to the First National Bank Pig Club. The youngsters belonging to these clubs will have a contest all their own and will be permitted to judge against the old folks on prize livestock.

With several hundred acres, previously not under cultivation, seeded last year to alfalfa there will be competition in the Grimm and Cossack alfalfa growers. More than 300 growers are eligible to compete in this class.

The premium list which will be published soon will contain more than double the activities of any other year. The merchants of Redmond have come to the front to assist the Tumalo people in promoting their fair with a subscription of \$200. The First National Bank has appropriated \$100 and Deschutes county \$500.

It is expected that this year's fair will give the people of Central Oregon a more comprehensive idea as to the type of farmers on the Tumalo project and what they are doing to make Central Oregon a producing center.
