FARMERS NEED MUCH SULPHUR

400,000 POUNDS WILL BE USED IN COMING YEAR IN DE-SCHUTES COUNTY, ESTIMATES FARM BUREAU.

That the farmers of Dechutes county will need in the neighborhood of 400,000 pounds of sulphur for use on alfalfa lands during the next year, was the decision reached Saturday night by members of the Dechutes County Farm Bureau, at their meeting at Redmond. This quantity, it is estimated, will be sufficient to reinforce the soil of 4,000 acres, equal to the amount used during the past season. A committee was appointed to get figures on the amount needed by the individual farmers.

Addresses were given by Guy Dobson, of Redmond, and R. A. Ward, of Bend, on the Banker-Farmer mixer, to be held September 1.
