We know of no better quotation with which to mark the beginning of Thrift week than the following from "David Copperfield," Charles Dickens's greatest novel. David is about to leave the Micawber home and his host is giving him advice for the future.

"My other piece of advice, Copperfield," said Mr. Micawber, "you know. Annual income twenty pounds, annual expenditure nineteen nineteen six, result happiness. Annual income twenty pounds, annual expenditure twenty pounds ought and six, result misery. The blossom is blighted, the leaf is withered, the God of day goes down upon the dreary scene, and—in short you are forever floored."

Though the idea is clothed in the somewhat extravagant language which marked Mr. Micawber's conversation, and though it may seem a bit strong to say that to over spend your income by the small sum of six pence brings misery, the fundamental fact is as described. To live within one's income is a satisfaction; to live beyond it, a continual torment.

It is to these facts home to the people and to start them off in the thrifty practices that mean happiness and contentment, as well as prosperity, that Thrift week is to be observed. Those who observe the thrifty commandments that are to be featured in the coming eight days not only help themselves. They make themselves better citizens and they give their families the established foundation of security against want.

Tomorrow is bank day on which it is urged that savings accounts be started. Returning to Mr. Micawber we would point out that the most complete happiness is attained only when that "six pence" saved from the year's income is deposited in a bank where it will be kept safely and set at work earning money for its owner.
