Robert E. Smith, of Portland, formerly Liberty Loan manager for the state of Oregon, is in town today on business.

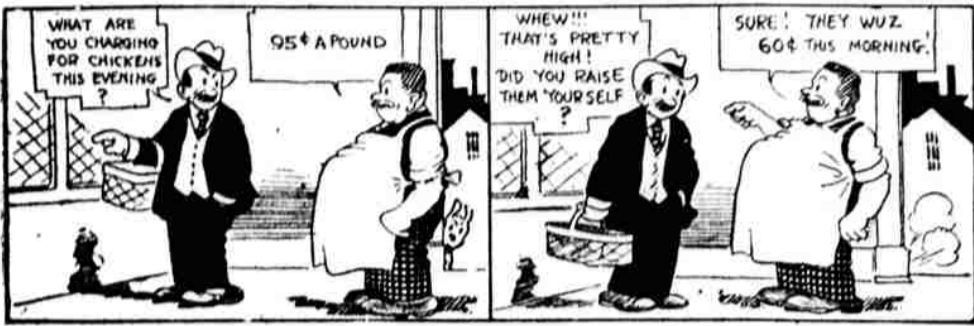
A license was issued last night from the office of the county clerk, to John P. O'Callaghan and Miss Evelyn A. Peterman.
