Bend Lawyer Considering Request That He Be Candidate, but Has Made No Decision.

The first mention of a candidate for the republican nomination for county judge is being made in the report which has come from a number of sources that E. O. Stadter, member of the Bend bar, will be in the running to succeed R. W. Sawyer.

When interviewed as to the possibility of allowing his name to appear on the republican ballot at the primaries, Mr. Stadter was unable to give definite confirmation of the report. "I have been asked by a number of people to enter the race," he said, "but to be quite frank, I have not yet made up my mind."

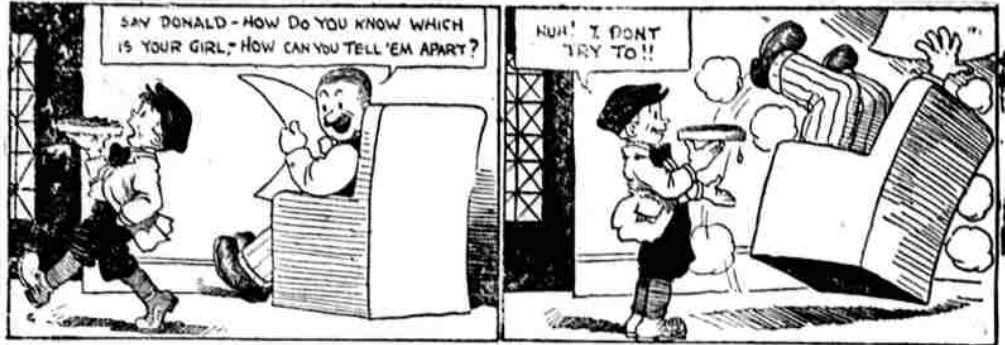
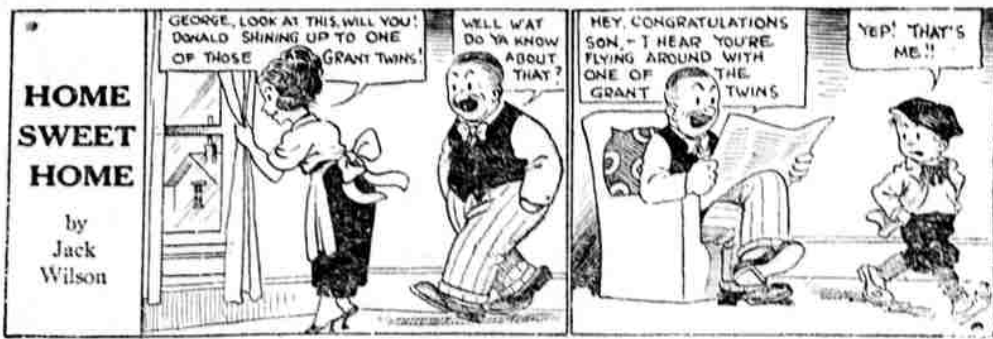

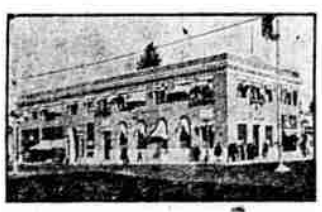
