

TWO PROGRAMS FOR TOMORROW

ELABORATE GYMNASIUM EXHIBIT AND MAY DAY FANTASY TO BE TAKEN PART IN BY MANY PUPILS.

Two elaborate programs, in which the pupils of the Bend schools will take part, will be presented tomorrow under the direction of Miss Ella Dews, head of the physical training department, the first, consisting of an exhibition of gymnasium work, to be held at the gymnasium, while the second, a May day fantasy, will commence on the lawn of the Reid school at 2 o'clock in the afternoon, the hour being advanced from that previously announced. Those attending either or both of the programs are invited to bring their luncheons and enjoy a picnic at the Reid school at 12:30 o'clock.

The numbers for the gymnasium exhibit, as announced by Miss Dews today, are: Imitative gymnastics and Danish dance of greeting, by pupils of the first grade of the Kenwood, Central and Reid schools; calisthenics by fourth grades of the Reid and Central schools; gymnastic drill by high school girls; wand drill by fifth and sixth grade pupils of the Kenwood and Reid schools; calisthenics by fifth and sixth grade boys, and gymnastic folk dances.

The May day fantasy will open with the entrance of a troop of Boy Scouts, bearing their colors. They will be followed by the May queen, Nellie Leslie, with her attendants, Connie Knickerbocker, Margaret Inabnit, Cletas Sherwood and Mary E. King, with Gay Hamilton, Yvonne Shepherd and Dorris Hudson as flower girls and Spencer Collins as page.

Folk dances will follow, including an English dance by Central and Kenwood school third and fourth graders, an Irish jig by junior high school girls, an Italian dance by third, fourth and fifth graders from the Reid, a minuet by high school girls, an Indian dance by third, fourth, and fifth grade boys from the Reid, Kenwood, and Central a Dutch dance by third, and fourth grade pupils from the Reid and Kenwood schools, and a Highland fling by junior high school girls. The fantasy will reach its climax with a May pole dance in which fifth, sixth, seventh, and eighth grade girls will take part.

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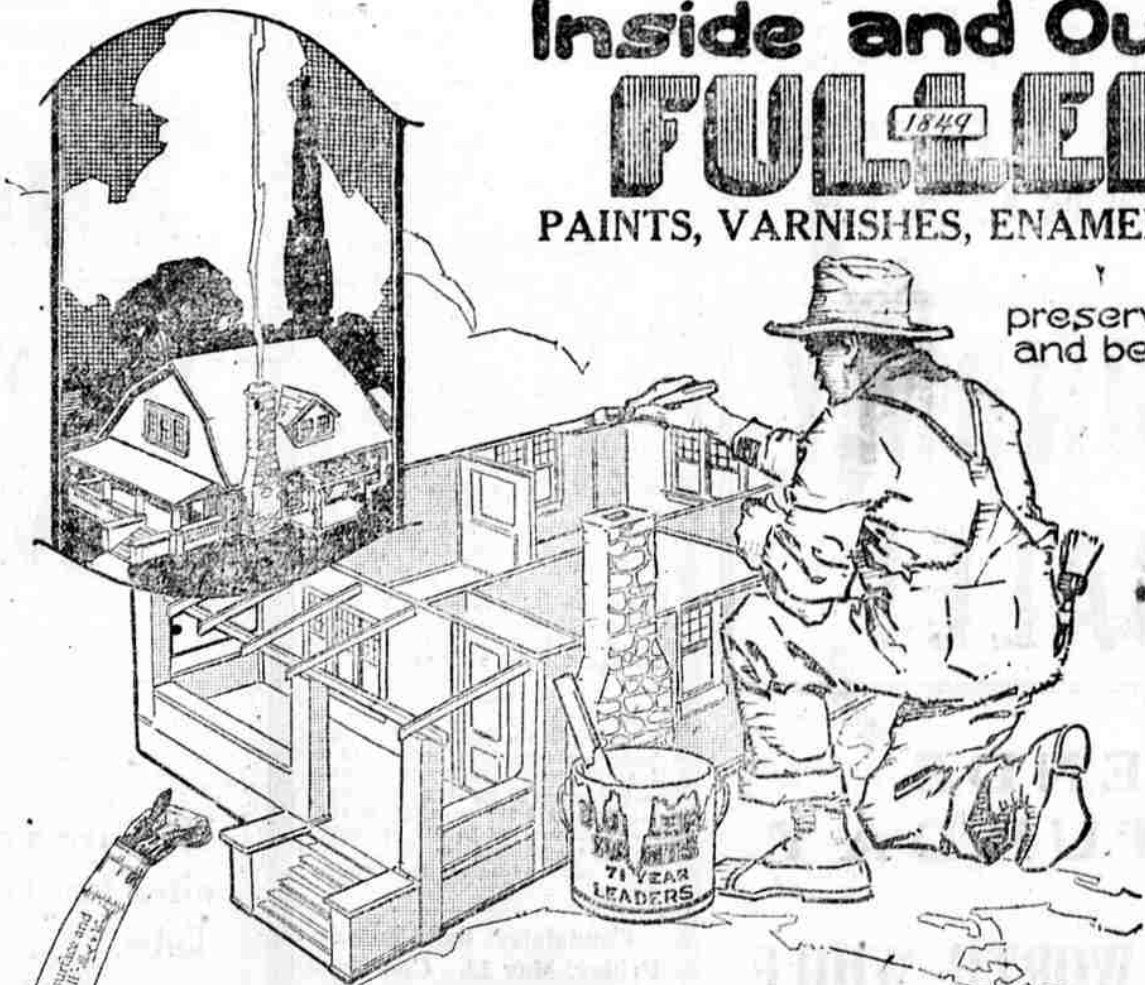
