

"SOME PARTY" SAYS HINSHAW

NATIONAL CHAIRMAN OF DRY FORCES CLAIMS CREDIT FOR WOMAN SUFFRAGE, AND ALSO CHILD LABOR REFORM.

LINCOLN, NEBRASKA, July 21.—"Haven't we had some party?" National Chairman Virgil C. Hinshaw asked the opening session of the prohibition party convention here today.

Hinshaw enumerated the planks the party had sponsored before the old parties had taken them up or they had been adopted without old party sponsorship. Among those for which he claimed credit to the prohibition party were woman suffrage, civil service, direct election of senators, opposition to lotteries, opposition to white slave traffic, child labor laws, uniform marriage and divorce laws and, above all, prohibition.

Hinshaw told of the lost plank in the republican platform.

"According to the testimony of William Allen White and Reed Smoot," he said, "the resolution committee adopted a dry plank, but it was lost on the way to the convention. The entire convention adopted by unanimous vote a law enforcement plank, but that plank was lost on the way from the national convention to the republican party printing press and that declaration is missing from the official platform issued by the republican party headquarters."
