

# FIRST BEND STREET GUIDE IS PRESENTED TO PEOPLE BY DIRECTORY COMPILERS

Bend's first street guide has just been completed. It is the work of representatives of the R. L. Polk & Co. who have been securing data for their directory of Deschutes county, and is presented without charge to the people of this city with the compliments of the directory company. Much of the information necessary in the compilation of the guide was secured in the office of City Engineer Robert B. Gould. The explanation of the plan on which the city's streets are laid out and numbered, as well as their location, is given below:

The City of Bend is divided in three sections for the purpose of naming the streets, the western section being that part west of the Deschutes river; the eastern section being that east of Division street, a street running north and south and parallel to the west side of the Oregon Trunk railway; the central section contains the business district and lies between the Deschutes river and Division street. General direction of all avenues is east and west and general direction of all streets north and south. All roads are short streets in western section. All places are short streets in central section. All drives are in the eastern section. There is a supplementary section lying southeast of the Oregon Trunk railway and south of the Brooks-Scanlon mill yards. In this section the short streets are called lanes. All other streets are a continuation of streets in eastern and central section except that they have the prefix south. Numbering system allows a number to every ten feet, 100 numbers to the block. All even numbers on north and east side of street, odd numbers the opposite. Numbers start from the mill yards and run north on the streets. The numbers in west section run from east to west from Deschutes river, and central section run from east to west from Division street, and in eastern section from Division street in the opposite direction.
