## QUACKS' END SEEN IN MEDICAL BILL

Drastic Legislation Aimed To Put Stop To Sale of Patent Remedies in Great Britain.

(By United Press to The Bend Bulletin)

LONDON, Sept. 21.—The man who comes to England to try to sell a box of pills which will cure sciatia, lumbago, rheumatism, backaches, tired feet, scarlet fever and measles is going to have a sorry time.

The proprietary medicines bill has arrived to put to stop to his oratory. "Quack" remedies are to be prohibited and all proprietary preparations and appliances are to be registered complete, with full description, as well as the owner's name.

Some remedies are prohibited altogether. Among these come remedies for cancer, consumption, lupus, deafness, fits, epilepsy, diabetes, paralysis, locomotor ataxia, Bright's disease and hernia. These may not be sold or offered or advertised for sale, and the prohibition applies to "any medicine or surgical appliance of any kind whatsoever purporting or stated directly, or by implication, to be effective for the prevention, cure, or relief of the diseases named." Other diseases may be added at the discretion of the minister of health.

## MOROCCO THRIVES, AMERICANS REPORT

PARIS, Sept. 21.—Two American Red Cross officers, Captains Robert S. Doman of Bay City, Mich., and Merl LaVoy of Seattle, Wash., who have returned to Paris after an official tour of Northern Africa, give some interesting figures to indicate that Morocco is rapidly gaining in economic importance. From a wild expanse of unproductive country, peopled largely by Arab tribes in 1912, Morocco has developed in the past seven years into what promises to become a thriving modern commercial and industrial nation, doing business on a large scale in all the markets of the world.
