FIRE PREVENTION

In calling attention to the governor's designation of October 9 as Fire Prevention day Mayor Eastes exactly stated the case when he said that the time to put out fires is before they start. An ounce of prevention is worth more than a pound of cure and the slight effort necessary to guard against a fire's starting is as nothing when compared with the loss that may occur if a fire does start.

When one takes into account the amount of prevention work done daily by the fire department it seems almost superfluous to plan the observance of a special day, as requested by the governor. Other communities may need waking up, one may feel, but not Bend; and yet even here it is worth while bringing into clearer relief the importance and necessity of fire prevention, and especially to educate and develop interest in the work the fire department is doing. We must all become members of a greater fire prevention department.

The present fire department is almost a child of the mayor's. He has taken a deep and active interest in its development and while to Chief Carlson and the loyalty of his department members must be given the credit for the actual work done, Mayor Eastes' cooperation and willing support should be recognized. The rest of us can now do little else than to show our appreciation by joining wholeheartedly in the plans they are making for Fire Prevention day.

IN THE COUNTY COURT OF THE STATE OF OREGON FOR THE COUNTY OF DESCHUTES.

In the Matter of the Organization of The Sisters Irrigation District, Notice of Election.

Notice is hereby given that on Saturday, the 9th day of October, 1920, at the following polling place, to-wit: The Millard T. Triplett ranch near Sisters, Oregon, and within the boundaries hereinafter described, all in Deschutes County, Oregon, an election will be held to determine whether or not the territory mentioned within the hereinafter mentioned and described boundaries shall be organized into an irrigation district under the provisions of Chapter 357 of the General Laws of Oregon for the year 1917 and all Acts amendatory thereto, under the name of THE SISTERS IRRIGATION DISTRICT, which has been, by the County Court of Deschutes County, Oregon, designated as the name of said proposed district and the electors therein are hereby required to cast their ballots upon the following question, to-wit:

"Shall THE SISTERS IRRIGATION DISTRICT be organized?"
Irrigation District.....Yes
Irrigation District.....No
At the same time three directors at large shall be elected in said district which said election shall be held at 8 o'clock in the forenoon and continue until 8 o'clock in the afternoon of said day.

The boundaries of said proposed irrigation district as fixed by said County Court are described as follows:

Beginning at the SW corner of Section 20, Township 15, South of Range 10, East of the Willamette Meridian, Deschutes County, Oregon, thence Northerly along the Section lines 3 miles to the NW corner of Section 8; thence Easterly 1 mile to the NE corner of said Section 8; thence Northerly along the Section line 3 miles to the SW corner of the NW 1/4 NE 1/4 of said Section 4; thence Easterly 1 mile to the SE corner of the NE 1/4 NE 1/4 of said Section 4; thence Southerly along the Section line 3 miles to the SE corner of said Section 4; thence Easterly 1 mile to the NE corner of Section 10; thence Southerly 1/2 mile to the SE corner of SE 1/4 NE 1/4 of said Section 10; thence Westerly 1/2 mile to the SW corner of the SE 1/4 NE 1/4; thence Southerly 1/2 mile to the SE corner of the SW 1/4 SE 1/4 of Section 10; thence Westerly along Section lines 1 1/2 miles to SW corner of Section 9; thence Southerly 2 miles to the SE corner of Section 20; thence Westerly 1 mile to the SW corner of said Section 20, Township 15; South of Range 10, E. W. M., being the place of beginning.

Excepting therefrom all of Sections 9, 17 and the W 1/2 of Section 20, all in Township 15, South of Range 10, East of the Willamette Meridian and excepting also, therefrom, the following tract:

Beginning at the SW corner of Section 4, Township 15, South of Range 10, E. W.
